COLOMBIA

Oasis is a sponsorship program that serves close to 80 at-risk kids, whose families are garbage recyclers. The program enables children from the local community of Santa Cecilia to attend the program at the church five days a week. Children receive lunch, academic help, and most importantly, receive daily Biblical teaching and a beautiful glimpse of Christ's love for them. **Zoe Homes Network** mission is to provide a Colombian teen from a troubled home with a safe place to heal, learn, and grow.

COSTA RICA

Spartans Basketball Club is an outreach ministry for adults and children. The Spartans Recreation Division introduces basketball skills and training to local neighborhoods. The Spartans are teaching basic basketball skills to the next generation of basketball players.

ECUADOR

Bonsai is a daycare program that meets five days a week. Bonsai carries out their ministry in a holistic approach that focuses on the emotional, physical, and spiritual health of their students.

Casa Elizabeth serves as a home for pregnant teens and for their babies after birth in Quito. The heart is to provide a safe place where they can see and feel the love of Jesus and receive the support that they need during this crisis.

Cumbre Alta serves youth and children through soccer and, in the future, other sports. The coaches, who are all Christians, use soccer to disciple their players, most of whom are not yet Christians.

El Hormiguero is a social help program where families in vulnerable situations such as poverty, catastrophic illnesses and migration, can exchange plastic bottles for a food basket of non-perishables.

Ninawachi Mission Institute is a missionary training institute that is in the jungle. The goal of Ninawachi is to train up missionaries from the local indigenous communities to return to their communities to share the Gospel with their people.

Portoviejo 7.8 is a daycare program that meets three days a week and works with the children who live near the garbage dump in Portoviejo.

Quinta Casablanca is Inca Link's guest house, making the mission field feel like home and a piece of heaven. It also houses retreats, pastors, and leaders.

GUATEMALA

Creación de Dios is a ministry with at-risk kids in the city of Guatemala, providing food, tutoring, and God's love, word, and truth. They meet three times a week with dozens of kids who are learning to survive and thrive in life.

Manos de Cristo is a child sponsorship ministry providing educational support for kids to get a quality education who typically would not be able to afford it. By providing for their educational needs, these kids and young people are breaking the cycle of poverty.

HONDURAS

Casa Onesíforo serves the new generation of Támara through a feeding program, practically showing the love of Christ.

El Recreo is a project that started when leaders from Inca Link Honduras realized the local school in Pueblo Viejo did not have a recess time for the kids. This project runs activities with the kids during their new recess time and seeks to teach the children that Christ is not boring.

INTERNATIONAL

Corban is an international traveling worship band whose mission is for each presentation to connect the hearts of the people with the heart of God.

MÉXICO

We are excited about the ministry opportunities that exist in México and are confident God will bring the right long-term missionaries to Inca Link to support locally led ministries serving the vulnerable throughout the Tijuana Region. As an organization, Inca Link has long term and fruitful relationships with ministries in northern Baja working with migrants, survivors of human trafficking, orphanages, and a men's drug rehabilitation center.

Partnerships: Inca Link Guatemala is partnering with Doulos and Alas, two ministries that impact different parts of Guatemala, bringing Creación de Dios and Manos de Cristo together to have a greater impact.

La Sierra involves a team that is working for the children and youth of La Sierra, Intibucá, Honduras, because we believe that God has placed us here to share God's love with them and help them in their integral life in society. This program includes discipleship, teaching the kids to read and write, and teaching math.

PERÚ

Amijai is a ministry for women, children and teens. Amijai uses fellowship with the mothers and their children as an opportunity to teach handiwork, cooking, art, and share the Gospel.

Elim is a garbage dump ministry. It operates several days a week serving the community in a variety of ways. The hope is that Elim will raise up a generation of leaders who will continue to impact their community.

Inca Thakhi is an outdoor camp and sports ministry. The Inca Thakhi Team provides an ideal space for the kids and youth of Victor Raul to foster a deep relationship with Christ via discipleship through adventures in nature. **Mana** is a day care center, and programs happen there 6 days a week. Mana is working on loving the children of the community, mentoring and discipling teens, and bringing unity to families through spiritual growth.

Misión Más Vida is a church that is reaching the next generation in Lima, Peru, and coordinates with other churches in Lima. It is growing fast with new conversions and baptisms every year.

Runa Simi is a ministry that exists to reach the indigenous people groups of Peru with the Word of God in their own languages. Runa Simi runs a literacy program so that people can be able to read God's Word.

USA

Cumbre Alta Fútbol Camps is a series of bilingual youth summer soccer camps throughout the United States hosted by Casa Deportiva Cumbre Alta, from Quito, Ecuador. The staff is made up of Cumbre Alta professional soccer players and coaches. They seek to provide a professional-quality soccer camp experience to those that may not be able to access an opportunity like this. **Cumbre Alta Bossier City** is a soccer club located in Bossier City, Louisiana. Their goal is to steer the players to the skills they need to better themselves as players and lead them off the field with the word of God.



Cumbre Alta has had a significant impact since 2011, reaching nearly 1000 people from young aspiring players to professional athletes with the truth of Jesus' love.

This summer, with a group of our players from Quito, Ecuador, Cumbre Alta organized five camps across four different U.S. cities, where they helped foster a love of the game, while introducing 750 kids to the gospel! This successful endeavor also played a pivotal role in launching Inca Link USA.

Currently, our most pressing concern within Inca Link is the potential threat of Cumbre Alta losing access to the soccer field they call home in Ecuador.

This is a potential that could become a reality in the next year or two, and one that would have a profound impact on the organization and our reach.

Cumbre Alta needs your help to secure their forever home that would not only serve as their stadium, but also team housing, group housing and a place to develop, disciple and share Jesus with the rising generation.

BONSAI AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAM

AS SHARED BY DIRECTORS WILL & AMANDA EASON

One way God is changing our ministry is due to the fact that we now have teenagers in Bonsai and not just children. We are having to mold the way we work with these teens as they are dealing with many emotional issues that children do not. We are having to change our methods of reaching them for Christ.

We are also working with these students more in the areas of life skills, life planning, and dating. We will (God willing) have our first high school graduates in February of 2025 and will be implementing a new sponsorship program to help these students further their education or start job training.

One other way we have seen God changing our ministry is through our ministry center. We previously had plans to build a large site and have up to 120 students in Bonsai. God has been changing our hearts in the best ways we can reach more children and students.

Instead of a large site with many children, we are looking to form partnerships with other local churches who want to start another Bonsai location. It can be started using the facility that the church already has and with volunteers from within the church. This way, each new Bonsai site can grow quicker, cost much less to get off the ground, and better reach its community. The staff and volunteers of the new sites can better connect the kids and parents to their local church. We feel that growing in this way will be more healthy and be more impactful to the children, students, and families.

WE ARE THANKFUL FOR:

- We have added 9 new children to the program this year.
- Our Bonsai team and staff are more unified than ever before.
- Our Bonsai teenagers are having a much better year in school this year.

PLEASE PRAY:

We ask for God's protection due to increased violence in Ecuador, but especially on the coast. We ask for protection for our staff, missionaries, and students and their families. Many of our Bonsai families live in dangerous areas where there are people being killed due to gang and drug-trafficking activity. We also ask for prayer as we move forward with raising the last funds needed to purchase a property near our Bonsai site that would allow for a play space for Bonsai, classroom space for the teenagers, and housing for teams.





NINAWACHI MISSION INSTITUTE

When COVID first came out, it seemed like it did not affect Ninawachi in any major way. Everything on campus continued as if there was no pandemic; it was only our reach-out ministries that stopped for a long while. However, in 2023 we felt the effects in recruiting because we were unable to recruit the number of students we hoped for. That said, recently we revisited our recruiting plan and are working on a new one. Furthermore, we also reassigned the different ministry areas, and everyone is working on a new strategy for their area.

In 2023, God has worked in spectacular ways! Firstly, in our team, he is making us mature, remembering that God has started a good work and is not going to stop. Next is with the groups that have come this year; it has been a tremendous blessing and we are recharged with his Holy Spirit. The students are also excited to share the good news.



WE ARE THANKFUL FOR:

- We took short-term teams to visit the sick, elderly and widows. They prayed for them, loved them, and did small construction projects on their homes.
- The Christian and Missionary Alliance Church of Huaticocha needed a lot of work and Ninawachi was able to provide for them.
- Ninawachi was always one of very few organizations bringing the Gospel to the Ecuadorian jungle communities. After COVID, this is more true.
- Spiritual and material provisions, which allow us to focus more on His work.
- Allowing the Gospel to be shared in the communities, though the team is inexperienced.
- Allowing us to be those channels of blessing in the communities through the Word, visits, and food.

PLEASE PRAY:

- For success in recruiting. We would like to recruit around 25 students for the 2024 year.
- For success in the new ministry area assignments. Leaders are overseeing new areas.
- That we continue with more love, mercy and humility, so that the scene of the Gospel of Christ is not lost.
- For the Miller family and their Ecuadorian Visas to be granted quickly.

The leaders of the churches do have Quechua Bibles but very few are able to read them. Even Brother Alejandro, who is one of the leaders of the Presbyterian church in Lircay, is unable to read.

Hilda was able to take several solar powered audio Bible players with the whole Quechua Bible (Genesis through Revelation). One of those she gave to Alejandro, who has listened to it almost nonstop since the time he received it. In fact, neither he nor his wife know how to read. While there, Hilda also taught a booklet called "The heart of man" which has lots of illustrations (again in Quechua, their heart language).

Many were touched by it, including Alejandro's wife who said, "I can understand by just looking at the pictures." Both are thrilled with these tools that enable them to share the Gospel. Pray for literacy groups for this area and for more audio Bibles.

I lead and guide Global Outreach Teams, serving as a bridge between two cultures. Responsibilities in my role include interpreting, taking care of the team, and leading debriefs and devotions. I also do pre-trip training and post-trip debriefs and follow-ups. God uses me to continue and complete the work He does in people's hearts and minds on the trip.

HOW DID THE LORD LEAD YOU TO THIS ROLE?

I met Luke Schriefer who came to our church to meet with us about a missions trip. At lunch after church, as he began to talk to me about a position in Inca Link, I heard God asking me to work for Inca Link.

HOW HAS THE LORD CHANGED YOU/YOUR LIFE THIS YEAR?

So many ways, but I think the two biggest things that God has shown me are this: Just because it's hard, doesn't mean God isn't in it. In fact, it may be much tougher to follow God's calling than not to. And secondly, God has helped me to see that He is always working to complete what He started, both in me and in others. God first called me to missions in college 17 years ago, and now the promise is completed through my work with Inca Link.

That I continue to lean on God and listen for His voice in guiding teams. Pray that God would call people into full-time missions work through teams.
