In the community of Higuito, Veracruz, we were able to enter a public school with more than 600 students, there we did several remodeling projects of the school facilities. We also had the opportunity to conduct three Bible classes where we were able to share the gospel with more than 200 children.

Also, this year we were able to team up with the association of Montufar (where we carry out the basketball and soccer ministry). We were able to give English classes to the community of Montufar in the association's hall, where we reached an agreement where they will allow us to host our global outreach teams. This is a great achievement for ILCR because we will no longer lose time in transportation and we will be able to use 100% of the time in the community.

We got to see so many teams come through here and work with us, while sharing God's love to hundreds of kids around our area. We ran everything from a VBS in a public school, to construction projects in our local church, school, and cafe. It's been amazing to see how God has connected a great relationship to come out of the work we've been doing here. The partnerships we've been able to make are unreal, and we couldn't be more grateful.

- God allowed us to have our first teen camp this year with the church of Tres Ríos, we started this camp with no funds and God gave us everything we needed through many donations (two donations were from churches of global outreach teams that came to help us in ILCR) and sales that we made.

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In February 2024, Tucántico Cafetería (ILCR's first financial engine) opened! Throughout this year, we have made numerous menu changes to try to attract more business, we have made cosmetic changes to make the cafe a more inviting space, and through many ups and downs, we have hired two wonderful employees!

We have been using many different marketing tactics including coffee samples on the college campus, free English classes in the cafe, creating student combos, buy one get one free pastries on Fridays, and of course social media! Through these strategies, we now have regular customers and are becoming more known throughout UCR (the local college campus) with groups of students coming to the cafe to study or just hang out!

We had the opportunity to host all the teams that came through ILCR at the cafe for some of their meals and through their support as well as an increase in business, July was Tucántico's first month of self sustainment!

In August, we tossed around the idea of Tucántico becoming mobile to help market our brand throughout the city, but also to create more income. In October, Tucántico went mobile for the first time at a local two-day cultural festival! The festival was a huge success and we are already signed up for three more local fairs/ festivals! We are excited about these opportunities as we believe they will push us into more months of self-sustainment and ministry profit!



WE ARE THANKFUL FOR:

- While hosting ESL classes at the cafe, we met a student named Jairo. It became evident to us that he does not know the Lord, but one day as he was walking back to campus with another ESL student, he shared with her that something felt different about Tucántico and the people there. This is a huge answer to prayer as Luke and I (Maddy) have been praying for that exactly since before we even landed in Costa Rica - that Tucántico would be a place that overflows the love of Jesus and that He would be evident to all who walk in. Jairo expressed his desire for community and continued English learning, which has created an opportunity for Luke to meet with him on a weekly basis practicing English, but also sharing Jesus.
- Luke and I have had the opportunity to start a Bible study out of our home every Friday night on the book of John with about seven students, two of whom are our employees! This has created another opportunity, specifically with our employee Raquel, to share with her who Jesus really is. One night at Bible study, Luke asked how everyone had seen God in the passage. When it came time for her to answer, she shared just how amazed she was at who God is because she had never heard these things about God before or read these passages before. It's just so amazing to us how when we pray for opportunities to share Him with others, He places them right in our lap.

- For renewed strength, favor and grace.


INCA LINK ECUADOR

AS SHARED BY ILE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR PEDRO CONTAG

When you consistently work with people and provide them with opportunities while sharing God's love, you need a place to do it, a home. Inca Link Ecuador works in multiple diverse homes; some shared, some rented, some owned, some roomy, some tight. Everyone needs their home, a place to mature, to share and make community, a safe place to learn to love. These past months, God has given us his hand and our homes are getting enhanced, roomier and more impactful.

El Hormiguero has relocated to a space in a church closer to the people we serve in Quito, and they are partnering with us by not only providing space, but sharing their community dining room program with us to make a more integral impact on lives that need some push to move forward.

The outdoor home at P7.8 is a more versatile space where kids not only play soccer, but they do all the physical activities we do in the ministry. This past summer, with the work of the community and the resources from global outreach teams, our dirt court was changed to sand.



Finally, we are thankful, joyful, amazed as Cumbre Alta has now acquired their home – a 10.4 acre lot with the best characteristics to "settle down". Our current field could not physically or logistically support our family of hundreds of players; including boys, girls, teens and professional teams that use it and share life together. A campaign planned for 18 months to raise the \$1.3 million needed became a six-month success with a \$100K deduction from the price. Now, the work is ongoing so that it is ready for use in 2025. Praise God!

WE ARE THANKFUL FOR:

• All our home improvements. Do so remembering that these are our spaces to touch people's lives and to share God's love, and He has gracefully provided us with resources and blessed our work in fundraising beyond our dreams. Your prayers will abound in God's provision for us.

• For all of our ministries as we continue experiencing blackouts through this drought in Ecuador.





PORTOVIEJO CHURCH SERVES IN NINAWACHI

AS SHARED BY P7.8 DIRECTOR PERCY FIGUEREDO

ECUADOR

Our church took a mission trip to Ninawachi to provide general medical checks to the community. We started every day with a devotional on the Gospel of Luke, then provided medical care to the community. In the evenings, we went out to preach the gospel door to door. Approximately 794 medical services were provided, including general medicine, pediatrics, podiatry, psychology, dentistry, optometry, and hair care. We also saw 12 people give their lives to Christ! However, our team returned to Portoviejo challenged, recognizing there is a great need for medical care in this sector of the country.

There were a few times where our team ran into some unexpected communication barriers. We had to use a translator with some patients, as many spoke Shuar and Quichua. In the area of general medicine, many people did not know how to read, so the doctors had to mark both the pills and the prescriptions with colors to help reduce confusion. Furthermore, for meal times, it was necessary to use referential images; for example, they drew a piece of chicken to indicate lunch or the moon for the night and the sun for the day. On the first day, we ran out of medicine due to the large number of patients who arrived at Ninawachi. Praise God, Inca Link was able to buy \$500 worth of medicine in the city of Loreto, so that we were able to serve 100 more patients.

One of the patients we were able to help was a young man who was brought to the Ninawachi camp in the middle of a seizure. When they saw him, Pastor Percy and Luis Mendoza rushed him to the nearest hospital. However, upon arrival, the hospital staff refused to treat him due to a lack of doctors and medications. Faced with the despair of their relative, who was inconsolable and crying, the Ninawachi and Portoviejo teams laid their hands on the young man and prayed, giving his health and life into the hands of God. Praise God, he recovered and was walking around the Ninawachi campus with his friends a few days later!







BONSAI AS SHARED BY DIRECTORS WILL & AMANDA EASON

In 2024, we have continued working with students in Bonsai ages three to 18. After eight years of Bonsai, we hope to have our first high school graduate in early 2025. Our students just finished their second trimester and most have great grades.

Bonsai is not strictly for homework, but all students learn about Jesus weekly. We finished our study through the entire Bible and started again with the creation story in May. This year we have included more stories from the Old Testament in our Bible curriculum.

On July 4th, we were finally able to close on a new property that will serve as housing for teams and has already provided outdoor play space for our students. We are thankful to God for His provision. Bonsai has intentionally decided to keep small student to teacher ratios so that we can truly get to know each child and invest in their lives.

After an armed robbery in September 2024, all of our staff was truly shaken. We closed the program for three weeks to allow time for the drivers to get their documents renewed and pray and fast. Upon returning, we debriefed this with our students and the overwhelming response from all our students was how Bonsai is a safe place for them and for some, the only safe place in their lives. We have changed some of our practices to increase safety measures but also recognize how God is continuing to use us to show God's love and faithfulness to our students.

We continue to have deep conversations about families and problems and to be sounding boards and safe places for them to open and vulnerable.

WE ARE THANKFUL FOR:

- We were able to purchase a property in July 2024. This will help us with having teams, allow for outdoor play space for our students, and further expansion of our ministry in the future.
- God protected Will, Wilton, our staff, and students during the robbery. It could have been so much worse but we know God was and is in control.
- We added a group of new students last year. Many of them struggled at first but we see how they are now well-adjusted. The older girls have finally adjusted socially and the younger students who didn't want to do homework or even pick up a pencil have now improved drastically in their motor skills and completing their daily homework assignments.

- That we can get more funding to do some of the needed projects for teams to be able to use the new property. We have two teams coming in summer of 2025.
- For our safety. Manta has become much more dangerous due to gang activity and drug trafficking. Many of our students live in areas where people are being killed for their involvement in these activities.
- For a hunger and openness to the things of God from our students. Pray for more conversations where we can show our students that there is no hope in this world other than Jesus.
- For us as we continue on the second month of nationwide power cuts. This has limited us in helping with homework as we sometimes don't have power to print or internet to do homework assignments.

CASA ELIZABETH

AS SHARED BY DIRECTOR MARÍA FERNANDA BELTRÁN V.

This year, Casa Elizabeth has adjusted to become a refuge where our girls meet to find relief in their daily lives and also build networks.

The intentional work we do through Trauma Healing, which we received certification for as facilitators this year, and the workshops for parents led by our clinical psychologist is giving great results that pave the way to restore the family nucleus and thus impact society.

Currently, we are serving 15 youth and their families supporting them because we are working integrally, which expands our reach (to an average of 45 people).

One of the girls we have been able to support and minister to this year was J, a woman who lived with us 11 years ago with a child who was a baby at the time. J was expecting a second child and had emotional and financial struggles and needed a place to live in the last months of pregnancy. Casa Elizabeth staff prepared everything and hosted her for the time needed, and we were able to support her emotionally and physically; she even gave birth at Casa Elizabeth! This was unexpected and not our typical practice, but God helped us and it was uneventful except for a new life!

J completed her time with us, but she came out stronger emotionally and financially. She knows she is loved and our doors are open for her.

WE ARE THANKFUL FOR:

- God has rescued and reunited families, bringing them to redemption.
- We have testimonies from our girls who have overcome difficult situations (deep depression, child abuse, self-harm, eating disorders). We have been that early help and now they are stable.
- We discovered that almost all of the mothers of our pregnant and preventing teens were teen mothers themselves and we have been able to help them heal from the pain of the stigma, of rejection, that they were passing on to their generations and are restoring mother-daughter relationships.

- For wisdom for the new challenges that we discover as we walk with our beneficiaries (addictions, sexuality issues in networks, etc.).
- For economic resources to sustain the management.





CUMBRE ALTA

AS SHARED BY DIRECTOR NATHAN TAUBE

This year, we purchased our forever home for Casa Deportiva Cumbre Alta and are in the middle of designing the whole layout of El Nido (The Nest). We opened Cumbre Alta Costa Rica and now have three club sites. Across these three sites, we have around 500 players (basketball and soccer) coming through our doors on a weekly basis. Every one of those players who walks through our doors has heard the gospel. We are also developing systems to be able to sustain growth and lessen the administrative burden on all three club sites. We are developing leaders and discipling more and more people.

We have way more teams than we did last year, which means we have way more people to disciple now. Particularly cool is our U16 and U14 girls teams. There is so much opportunity for impact on the women's side and it's fun to be a part of it. We have the makings of a SuperLiga winning side on our U14 girls team!

Overall, we had 30 adults, 20 children, and 15 teenagers attend this event! It was a wonderful time to bring families closer together and closer to God.

Zamari, a 13 year old girl from the P7.8 ministry, told us about her experience in the family retreat, "We have been very bored these days in Ecuador because they cut our electricity for more than 12 hours a day. I like to be in my classes in P7.8, but I loved going to the family day. I enjoyed playing, eating and listening to the word of God in the family day outing. I loved this day."

Dileidi is receiving psychological treatment since she confessed to us that she had been abused and had tried to take her own life when she was eight years old. Gema, her teacher, received this news and we immediately did a general medical check-up, examinations, check-up with the cardiologist, psychologist and also psychiatrist. We have managed at this moment to remove the suicidal thoughts and she can sleep well. Praise God for her life.

Our children continue to grow in learning the Bible with the Abanico de Valores program both in the Sector 9 landfill and in the building itself.

Ysabel del Carmen Garcia Pichi, a 51-year-old woman, learned about our Elim program by chance when she was leaving a language therapy center with her daughter, Chantal. Carmen expresses that she saw the children playing with Brent Frederick (the director of the project at that time) in 2019. She asked if her little daughter could join the children and she was accepted. Her daughter is now 12 years old and is diagnosed with ADHD, which limits her learning abilities. She has been a part of Elim's program since she was six years old, and to this day she is very happy enjoying the Elim programs such as the Palette of Values with its Detectives series, meetings with people with disabilities, and the incredible visits from teams when they come to Elim.

She is a very beloved teenager; she likes to talk, paint, and play. She is currently a student of Secondary Support (7th grade), and there we must support her so that she can learn. To accomplish this, we have created a curricular adaptation so that she can process her lessons and learn at her own pace.

Her mother, Mrs. Carmen, also supports us by welcoming students to the Affirmation Program on Saturdays, as well as guarding the door to control the entry and exit of the students. She also participates in craft programs.

Last year, Caleb arrived at MANÁ at eight years old through an invitation from his cousin to participate in the summer workshops that the ministry offers for free. Caleb came to MANÁ but was very closed off and reserved. He didn't want to play with the other kids and was easily upset.

After a couple of months, we received a visit from his father where he asked us if there was any way he could register Caleb to be part of the ministry officially and urgently. He explained how Caleb didn't have friends, nor community of any kind really and most days he spent alone at home while the rest of his family had to work. He said that Caleb had been struggling to socialize and communicate with others, and ultimately make friends. These struggles became more challenging for Caleb after the pandemic as well. His father expressed how necessary it is for him to be able to communicate with others, not just at school, but for his future and that he desired for his son to have friends and a safe community to grow in.

At MANÁ, we serve in one of the most impoverished neighborhoods of the city, however not all our kids have the same needs. Some desperately need the free meals we give out Monday through Friday, and others need the homework help and trade workshop classes we offer. Other kids are in need of a safe place to come to while parents work or just simply need friendships and community, such as Caleb. At the end of the day, we all need Jesus, and we try to share and show His love through the speed of relationships and support in a holistic way.

Currently, Caleb is one of our most social kiddos in the ministry. He has many best friends and is known for making everyone laugh. He is a friend to all and has grown so much in sharing and communicating. Caleb also goes to a local church and truly uses every opportunity throughout the day to praise God for the blessings he has received. He truly is a bright light for Christ, and we are so excited to see all the ways the Lord uses Caleb for His Kingdom and glory.

The estimate of Runa Simi's work for 2024 was done in the areas of Evangelism, Discipleship (youth, women and children ministries), leadership training, health (sports) and literacy.

Train and Multiply (leadership training): reached six places with a total of 142 pastors and leaders.

Women ministries: 308 women reached in the Andes and jungles.

Youth Ministry: 45 youth were trained in Chosica's youth conference with youth from six regions of Perú with apologetics and health workshops. One hundred and seventy trained in communities. Between 30-40 youth were involved locally in sports activities and local workshops.

Children Evangelism: 7,000 children were reached through our puppet ministry.

Literacy: 80 new readers, about 99 churches with literacy programs and Bible studies were led by our literacy trainers.

Cumbre Alta Fútbol Camp USA did seven soccer camps in four weeks in four different states. Over 700 campers, 20 coaches from Ecuador and USA came together and used soccer to share the gospel with the campers.

During one of our summer camps, coach Chelsey went to the head office of a daycare center and talked to a supervisor to get the kids to join the camp. The supervisor made a phone call and got the kids from the center to go out for about an hour and half for the last three days of camp. Those kids were all kids of migrant workers or construction workers. When they were handed their jerseys, they couldn't believe they got to keep them!

It was a weird start to camp; the kids were different, super passive and timid and almost apathetic. Everyone was having a hard time connecting. But by the third day of camp, they started to open up and everyone had so much confidence. It was probably the most growth we had seen in a group of campers from all of our camps.

On the last day of camp, a little seven-year-old hugged one of our coaches from Ecuador and told him, "I wish soccer camp was every week."



We donated a ball to every kid and did a gospel presentation in front of the parents and kids. Everyone was super thankful. So many parents came up to us to tell us how much this week meant to their kids. It was a wonderful time!

Since the end of camps this summer, we have been doing followup meetings with each of our camp coaches. It has been amazing to hear of the ways that the camp experience has impacted the coaches lives and really shows that Cumbre Alta Fútbol Camp is a full circle ministry – the coaches pour into the community and in return the coaches experience God in a new way. Chelsey met with one of our camp coaches last week who said that since camp, her perspective on coaching has changed. It now has a much deeper purpose. She used to just show up to practices and run drills, but now she realizes that each practice has a purpose and is an opportunity to show the love of God like we did at camp.

That at our age, God is not allowing us to stay comfortable and to be content with the status quo. Instead, He is leading us out into something completely new, and challenging us to trust Him more fully.


HOW CAN WE PRAY FOR YOU?



COLOMBIA

Oasis is a sponsorship program that serves close to 80 at-risk kids, whose families are garbage recyclers. The program enables children from the local community of Santa Cecilia to attend the program at the church five days a week. Children receive lunch, academic help, and most importantly, daily Biblical teaching and a beautiful glimpse of Christ's love for them.

Proyecto Confianza seeks to equip younger generations, parents and leaders to live an authentic and transforming faith from their identity in Christ through personal discipleship with high-impact biblical training.

Zoe Home's mission is to provide Colombian teens from troubled homes with a safe place to heal, learn, and grow. Keep reading to learn more about Zoe Home in our Year-End Campaign section "New Life in Colombia."

COSTA RICA

Cumbre Alta Costa Rica is an outreach ministry for adults and children. Cumbre Alta Costa Rica introduces basketball skills, soccer skills, and training to local neighborhoods. They are teaching basic sports skills to the next generation of players all while introducing them to the love of Jesus.

Tucántico is a coffee shop that embarks on a dual mission: to sustain ministry initiatives and nurture spiritual growth. As the current in-country primary revenue source for Inca Link Costa Rica, every cup brewed and pastry served directly supports vital outreach programs.

ECUADOR

Bonsai is a daycare program that meets five days a week. Bonsai carries out their ministry in a holistic approach that focuses on the emotional, physical, and spiritual health of their students.

Casa Elizabeth works in the prevention and accompaniment of teenage pregnancy with the vulnerable population of the northern sector of Quito.

Cumbre Alta serves youth and children through soccer and, in the future, other sports. The coaches, who are all Christians, use soccer to build genuine relationships that lead to opportunities to disciple their players, most of whom are not yet Christians.

El Hormiguero is a social help program where families in vulnerable situations such as poverty, catastrophic illnesses and migration, can exchange plastic bottles for a food basket of non-perishables.

E625 offers training and the best resources to those working to disciple the new generation of six- to 25-year-olds.

Ninawachi Mission Institute is a missionary training institute located in the jungle. The goal of Ninawachi is to train up missionaries from the local indigenous communities to return to their communities and share the Gospel with their people in their native language.

Portoviejo 7.8 is a daycare program that meets three days a week and works with the children who live near the garbage dump in Portoviejo.

Quinta Casablanca is Inca Link's guest house, making the mission field feel like home and a piece of heaven. It also houses retreats, pastors, and leaders.

GUATEMALA

Creación de Dios is a ministry with at-risk kids in the city of Guatemala, providing food, tutoring, and God's love, word, and truth. They meet three times a week with dozens of kids who are learning to survive and thrive in life.

Manos de Cristo is a child sponsorship ministry providing educational support for kids to get a quality education who typically would not be able to afford it. By providing for their educational needs, these kids and young people are breaking the cycle of poverty.

HONDURAS

Casa Onesíforo serves the new generation of Támara through a feeding program, showing the love of Christ practically.

El Recreo is a project that started when leaders from Inca Link Honduras realized the local school in Pueblo Viejo did not have a recess time for the kids. This project runs activities with the kids during their new recess time and seeks to teach the children that Christ is not boring. **Partnerships:** Inca Link Guatemala is partnering with Alas, a ministry that impacts different parts of Guatemala, bringing Creación de Dios and Manos de Cristo together to have a greater impact.

La Sierra involves a team that is working with the children and youth of La Sierra, Intibucá, Honduras, because they believe that God has placed them there to share God's love and help the children better understand how important they are in their community. This program emphasizes discipleship and teaching reading, writing and math.

INTERNATIONAL

Corban is an international traveling worship band whose mission is for each presentation to connect the hearts of the people with the heart of God.

Link Year is a gap year program that allows participants to grow deeper to go deeper within a life-on-life discipleship community.

MÉXICO

We are excited about the ministry opportunities that exist in México and are confident God will bring the right long-term missionaries to Inca Link to support locally led ministries serving the vulnerable throughout the Tijuana Region.

PERÚ

Amijai is a ministry for women, children and teens. Amijai uses fellowship with the mothers and their children as an opportunity to teach handiwork, cooking, art, and share the Gospel.

Elim is a ministry near the garbage dump. It operates several days a week serving the community in a variety of ways. The hope is that Elim will raise up a generation of leaders who will continue to impact their community.

Inca Thakhi is an outdoor camp and sports ministry. The Inca Thakhi team provides an ideal space for the kids and youth of the Victor Raul district to foster a deep relationship with Christ via discipleship through adventures in nature. **MANÁ** is a day care center, and programs happen there five days a week. MANÁ is working on loving the children of the community, mentoring and discipling teens, and bringing unity to families through spiritual growth.

Misión Más Vida is a church that is reaching the next generation in Lima, Perú, and coordinates with other churches in Lima. It is growing fast with new conversions and baptisms every year.

Runa Simi is a ministry that exists to reach the indigenous people groups of Perú with the Word of God in their own languages. Runa Simi runs a literacy program so people can read God's Word and grow closer to Him in their own personal relationship.

USA

Cumbre Alta Bossier City is a soccer club located in Bossier City, Louisiana. Their goal is to steer the players to the skills they need to better themselves as players and lead them off the field with the word of God. **Cumbre Alta Fútbol Camp** is a series of bilingual youth summer soccer camps throughout the United States hosted by Casa Deportiva Cumbre Alta from Quito, Ecuador. The staff is made up of Cumbre Alta professional soccer players and coaches. They seek to provide a professional quality soccer camp experience to those who may not be able to access an opportunity like this otherwise.
