In April 2025, our missionaries in Spain received a call asking if we had space to host two children, their mothers, and an interpreter coming to Barcelona for heart surgery. Unfortunately, housing in Barcelona is a serious problem—space is extremely limited and expensive.

At Inca Link España, we believe every child deserves a chance to heal and thrive. That's why we're launching CorHome—a place of refuge, comfort, and hope for all who come through our doors. Our vision is to provide comfortable housing for children in need, their mothers and interpreters, as they traverse the challenges of critical pediatric heart surgery and the recovery that follows.

Our goal is to serve six children per year as they receive the medical treatment they desperately need. These children will be welcomed into a space that's more than just a place to stay: it will be a sanctuary where they can heal not just physically, but emotionally as they are surrounded by love and support.

To ensure this ministry is self-sustaining, we plan to also host mission teams and interns at CorHome. The funds generated from these guests and supporters will contribute to the expenses of hosting families in need throughout the year. Additionally, when the apartment is available, the dream is for it to be rented out as an Airbnb as another layer of sustainability to help cover ongoing expenses, ensuring that we can continue offering this vital service for years to come.

These children, full of hope, are fighting for a chance at life.

With your help, we can give them the space and care they need to heal. Together, we can offer these families not just a roof over their heads, but a place to restore their hearts and experience the transforming love of Christ in the midst of their struggles.

We have established ourselves as a center for prevention and support for teenage pregnancy, reaching 20 teenage girls and their children. Our service has expanded to not only serve teens, but we are also working on behalf of their children and their nuclear families, which represent a community of 80 people.

The church has embraced us, and we currently have six churches linked to community service days with Casa Elizabeth (CE), who provide us with regular support and have developed a genuine relationship with our girls.

We see ourselves as a true refuge and have provided shelter to several people when they have gone through personal, family, or health crises, providing them with a safe, reliable place where they can come to rest and be cared for while they go through difficult situations.

A couple of testimonials: Vale* - she is no longer the disqualified student, and her teachers are amazed at her progress despite her early motherhood. Belén* - she has restored her relationship with her mother, is distancing herself from gangs, and is getting closer to the church in her search for a relationship with God. Mari*—found a place to be accountable for stopping the abuse of her children and decided to attend church. Ani* and Kari*—are street vendors to support themselves as teen moms and are grateful for the support as they discover who God is.

For our beneficiaries, we are a necessary place, a place of peace that they long to attend and where they know well that our goal is to be a channel for them to know God and encourage them to have a relationship with Him. All of them are open and willing to be evangelized.

In 2025, Cumbre Alta continued to deepen its intentionality in discipleship across everything we do, centering our efforts on fostering belonging that leads to discipleship — a focus that will guide us into the coming years as well. Throughout the year, multiple teams partnered with our sites in Ecuador and Costa Rica, strengthening relationships and advancing ministry on the ground. Our camps reached nearly 1,000 children, opening doors for meaningful connection, gospel conversations, and long-term impact. We also continued investing in the community of Yaruquí, building trust and presence around the location where our new property is being developed.

At the same time, we prioritized leadership development, training our coaches not only to excel in sport but to grow as leaders who disciple with intentionality and integrity. All of this took place within our commitment to holistic discipleship, as we seek to meet the everyday needs of players and families—many of whom come from low-resourced backgrounds—caring for the whole person, not just the athlete. Together, these efforts reflect our long-term calling: to form a community rooted in Christ, built on belonging, and transformed through deep, relational discipleship.

MANÁ

AS SHARED BY DIRECTORS JEFF SOLEDISPA & CHLOE CHILDERSTON

God has moved significantly in and through MANÁ in 2025 in many ways. We have worked with the cooks to improve our free lunches to be more nutritious and full of iron, and have seen a radical drop in anemia and malnutrition.

We have seen a significant increase in the children's grades through the homework help program, which has also helped increase self-confidence in the children and hope for a brighter future. MANÁ has all seven of our high school seniors graduating next month! This is a big deal as they are breaking generational poverty cycles, as the majority of their parents only got to study up to the elementary level of schooling.

It was also a successful year of workshops; from sewing, to baking, Canva to knitting, and more. The kids not only grew in skill and creativity, but many have been able to make a profit from what they've made to help their families. There has also been a big growth in fellowship through monthly events/field trips, with playtime, and sharing with one another in prayer.

This year, we have been able to not only connect with the kids, but a lot more with their parents as well, through meetings, events, social aid, and home visits. MANÁ also finished painting the



bottom-level classrooms and re-did the building's roof, plumbing, and electrical system to be up to code and safer. Twenty-four children were newly sponsored this year alone!


MANÁ also focused on mental health and the kid's emotional needs more this year through their prayer and care journals and weekly mental health lessons. And most of all, God used all these fruits to bring others closer to Him. We had intimate prayer and devotional times with the kids and showed them how they can have one one-on-one time with God and be in His Word. There was a major increase in the kids' curiosity and openness to faith, salvation, and going to church! Praise God!

WE ARE THANKFUL:

- God brought down walls and used MANÁ as the kids' (and their families) safe place for mental health, to share vulnerably, and pray in community. Weekly, we shared together, journaled, and worked through various mental health exercises in our Care and Prayer Journals. God used this time for processing and healing, growth in relationships, and dependence on the true Healer.
- God used our daily homework help time and did wonders. We just had home visits, and all parents agreed that they've seen a significant increase in their child's grades and educational performance, thanks to MANÁ. One example is that all 7 of our high school seniors are graduating next month. All of them are the first in their families to get this far, and they all desire to continue studying and are being evaluated to receive scholarships through Inca Link. This is a big deal as they are breaking generational poverty cycles, as the majority of their parents only got to study up to the elementary level of schooling.
- The ministry was significantly underfunded last year. At the start of 2024, MANA had only about a quarter of the children in the program sponsored. This year alone, through sharing, as well as interns and short-term teams, 24 children were sponsored! With an over \$1000 increase in monthly donations. We not only covered all the kids we had in the program, but we were also able to finally allow new children into the program who were on the waiting list. PRAISE GOD!

PLEASE PRAY:


 God is multiplying the children joining the program, the fruits and harvest, but the laborers are still very, very few. We are significantly short-staffed and have very few volunteers. There is a long waiting list of kids who want into MANÁ and need the help. Although we have recently slowly started receiving new kids into the program, without more help and eyes, it can be a safety risk and a burnout risk for us and our small team.

AS SHARED BY PASTOR ANTONIO ARGUMEDO



RUNA SIMI

Evangelism and Discipleship:

Train and Multiply Project: Six training sessions were held for Quechua pastors and leaders in Andean and jungle areas.

Women of the Bible Workshops: Three workshops were held for women leaders in Ayacucho and Chazuta. These training workshops use the theme "Women of the Bible" and other simplified Bible study materials in Quechua to equip women leaders, who then train other women in their communities. The goal was to reach 200 women this year.

Four Conferences for Quechua Women Leaders: One in Ayacucho, Tarapoto, Cusco, and Chosica.

One Youth Conference in Chosica: We also work with teenagers and young people weekly throughout the year, five days a week, at the Runa Simi center. We reach more than 60 young people from the Andean region, the jungle, and Lima.

Children's and Puppet Ministry: Reaching more than 15 Quechuaspeaking communities during 2025.

Radio and Communications:

Our Quechua radio programs have a wide reach. Each year, they reach approximately 13,250 people through our programs, either on the radio, internet radio, or by tuning in from other countries.

A basic Bible promotion workshop and conference was also held, providing training to leaders and equipping them with audio and video players to help promote the Bible. This basic training workshop was held in Ayacucho for leaders on how to use Bible videos to reach and disciple Quechua people for Christ. The goal is to evangelize and reach families and communities in both Lima and the highlands. They include the Jesus Film, the Luke video, the Genesis video, and the History of God video (plan of redemption). A conference was also held in November in Ayacucho to bring together all the leaders who have been traveling with the photoframes to receive additional training and have a time of fellowship.

Audio Bibles: In collaboration with Faith Comes by Hearing, Runa Simi distributed approximately 1,400 audio Bibles (Proclaimers or solar audio players) with the Quechua Ayacucho Bible narrated to churches and community groups in 2025.

WE ARE THANKFUL FOR:

- Watching our youth who we've been discipling accept Jesus as their Savior and some got baptized this year
- Watching others, especially those not expected to step up into leadership and do well
- God's provision for the ministry and how things came together, definitely a God thing

PLEASE PRAY FOR:

- · God's continued provision
- · More locals to step up and volunteer
- The whole Runa Simi team who work full time in Andean and jungle communities (it's not easy)

The distribution includes:

- 800 audio Bibles in the Quechua region of Ayacucho.
- 300 audio Bibles in the Cusco region.
- 200 audio Bibles in the Aymara region.
- 100 audio Bibles in Spanish.

In addition, Runa Simi distributed 400 "In Touch Messengers" to literacy groups and families.

Literacy:

Literacy materials and Bibles in Quechua for new readers. Runa Simi has three full-time literacy trainers and plans to hold 12 training seminars in 2025, including six for new literacy projects and six for ongoing programs. The program also teaches simple Bible courses to an estimated 100 pastors and leaders, encouraging them to read the Bible in Quechua. Follow-up support will be provided to ensure ongoing training and supervision.

Health:

In addition to our fitness courses, we also held two health workshops on how to prevent chronic diseases.

Christmas Project:

Our goal is to reach 1,550 children in Quechua communities this December 2025 with gifts, panettone, hot chocolate, and the message of the gospel in the regions of Ayacucho, Huancavelica, Andahuaylas, Cusco, Tarapoto, Pichanaki, and Lima. The project also provides food baskets to pastors and senior citizens, when possible.



INCALINK USA

AS SHARED BY ILUSA INTERIM EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AMANDA BURGE

ROOTS

Roots is a new, internally-run onboarding process that helps fast-track new hires to deeply know the Inca Link DNA and how we reach the next generation for Christ.

In a matter of months, we were able to set up and run our first ever Roots cohort, starting at the end of January 2025. We had six students, and five teachers. The first cohort was able to meet in person, only once in May, and the rest of the teaching time was over Zoom. It was good, but not ideal. Cohort 2 started at the end of August, where we met in person initially, had Zoom classes throughout the months of August and September. We met again in person for our in-person service, Exodus Forward, time in Ecuador. It was a great way to end Roots.

GLOBAL OUTREACH COACHES

HOW DID THE LORD LEAD YOU TO THIS ROLE?

Rebecca and Shane have always felt a calling to missions. Both had participated in short-term missions prior to meeting each other. Rebecca was a missionary teacher in Santa Cruz, Bolivia for a year. Their first date was actually looking over photos and talking about their mission trips! The plan was to go into full-time mission work after Shane retired from being a firefighter/paramedic in 11 years. But God had different plans.

In December of 2022, Shane volunteered with the safety team at the Urbana Missions Conference and Rebecca joined him to look for an organization that our church could partner with to take a team to Bolivia. This is when we met Rich and Elisa Brown. They told us that Inca Link currently wasn't in Bolivia but they were always squinting their eyes and ears to what God has for them and welcomed the opportunity for our church to take a team down to Bolivia with Inca Link. Shane and Rebecca, along with Rich and Elisa went on a vision trip to Bolivia in November of 2023 and the team traveled to Bolivia with Inca Link in March of 2024.

It was during this trip that Rich and Elisa asked Shane and Rebecca to consider going on staff with Inca Link as Global Outreach Coaches. After much prayer and discernment, in October of 2024, Shane and Rebecca committed to serving with Inca Link. On May 15th of 2025, Shane worked his last shift at the fire department and on June 8th of that year, the entire Westphal family flew down to Quito, Ecuador where they served alongside many of the Inca Link Ecuador ministries as Global Outreach Coaches. They returned to the US at the end of summer and continue in their role as Global Outreach Coaches. The family will return to Ecuador next summer.

HOW HAS THE LORD CHANGED YOU/YOUR LIFE THIS YEAR?

God has shown us that we need to have complete dependence on him and that we need to trust in his provision. This has challenged us to trust his faithfulness to the calling he has placed on our lives.

We are thankful for the things that God has shown us and how he has grown us throughout this time and the things he shows and continues to grow our three kids with through this calling.





COLOMBIA

Oasis is a sponsorship program that serves close to 80 at-risk kids, whose families are garbage recyclers. The program enables children from the local community of Santa Cecilia to attend the program at the church five days a week. Children receive lunch, academic help, and most importantly, daily Biblical teaching and a beautiful glimpse of Christ's love for them.

Proyecto Confianza seeks to equip younger generations, parents and leaders to live an authentic and transforming faith from their identity in Christ through personal discipleship with high-impact biblical training.

Zoe Home's mission is to provide Colombian teens from troubled homes with a safe place to heal, learn, and grow.

COSTA RICA

Cumbre Alta Costa Rica is an outreach ministry for adults and children. Cumbre Alta Costa Rica introduces basketball skills, soccer skills, and training to local neighborhoods. They are teaching basic sports skills to the next generation of players all while introducing them to the love of Jesus.

Inca Lengua gives low-income families the opportunity to learn English in a way that not only opens doors of physical opportunity but also spiritual.

Mission Costa Rica is focused on introducing the next generation of students to international missions through hands-on ministry in Costa Rica.

Tucántico is a coffee shop that embarks on a dual mission: to sustain ministry initiatives and nurture spiritual growth. As the current in-country primary revenue source for Inca Link Costa Rica, every cup brewed and pastry served directly supports vital outreach programs.

ECUADOR

Bonsai is a daycare program that meets five days a week. Bonsai carries out their ministry in a holistic approach that focuses on the emotional, physical, and spiritual health of their students.

Casa Elizabeth works in the prevention and accompaniment of teenage pregnancy with the vulnerable population of the northern sector of Quito.

Cumbre Alta serves youth and children through soccer and, in the future, other sports. The coaches, who are all Christians, use soccer to build genuine relationships that lead to opportunities to disciple their players, most of whom are not yet Christians.

El Hormiguero is a social help program where families in vulnerable situations such as poverty, catastrophic illnesses and migration, can exchange plastic bottles for a food basket of non-perishables.

E625 offers training and the best resources to those working to disciple the new generation of six- to 25-year-olds.

Lider Plus mentors new generation leaders by providing resources and tools with a focus on discipleship and developing in them the character virtues of Jesus.

Ninawachi Mission Institute is a missionary training institute located in the jungle. The goal of Ninawachi is to train up missionaries from the local indigenous communities to return to their communities and share the Gospel with their people in their native language.

Pluma Ligera shares Christian values through storytelling contests and writing schools.

Portoviejo 7.8 is a daycare program that meets three days a week and works with the children who live near the garbage dump in Portoviejo.

Quinta Casablanca is Inca Link's guest house, making the mission field feel like home and a piece of heaven. It also houses retreats, pastors, and leaders.



IVEB (Music & Arts) disciples young musicians to enjoy the music that God has created, share with others and generate disciples of Jesus.

COLAB's mission is to accompany local leaders in the development of their ministries and provide them with tools to help them bear fruit.

Copa Inca Link uses soccer as a connection between believers and non-believers, and thus share in the irresistible love of Christ.

CorHome longs that the heart of every person who stays there will be touched by the irresistible love of Christ.

GUATEMALA

Manos de Cristo is a child sponsorship ministry providing educational support for kids to get a quality education who typically would not be able to afford it. By providing for their educational needs, these kids and young people are breaking the cycle of poverty.

Partnerships: Inca Link Guatemala is partnering with Alas, a ministry that impacts different parts of Guatemala.

HONDURAS

Casa Onesíforo serves the new generation of Támara through a feeding program, showing the love of Christ practically.

Clases de Inglés reaches their community by teaching English classes free of charge and by dissimulating the attendees with the help of the local church.

El Recreo is a project that started when leaders from Inca Link Honduras realized the local school in Pueblo Viejo did not have a recess time for the kids. This project runs activities with the kids during their new recess time and seeks to teach the children that Christ is not boring.

La Sierra involves a team that is working with the children and youth of La Sierra, Intibucá, Honduras, because they believe that God has placed them there to share God's love and help the children better understand how important they are in their community. This program emphasizes discipleship and teaching reading, writing and math.

INTERNATIONAL

Corban is an international traveling worship band whose mission is for each presentation to connect the hearts of the people with the heart of God.

Link Year is a gap year program that allows participants to grow deeper to go deeper within a life-on-life discipleship community.



We are excited about the ministry opportunities that exist in México and are confident God will bring the right long-term missionaries to Inca Link to support locally led ministries serving the vulnerable throughout the Tijuana Region.



Amijai is a ministry for women, children and teens. Amijai uses fellowship with the mothers and their children as an opportunity to teach handiwork, cooking, art, and share the Gospel.

Elim is a ministry near the garbage dump. It operates several days a week serving the community in a variety of ways. The hope is that Elim will raise up a generation of leaders who will continue to impact their community.

Inca Thakhi is an outdoor camp and sports ministry. The Inca Thakhi team provides an ideal space for the kids and youth of the Victor Raul district to foster a deep relationship with Christ via discipleship through adventures in nature.

MANÁ is a day care center, and programs happen there five days a week. MANÁ is working on loving the children of the community, mentoring and discipling teens, and bringing unity to families through spiritual growth.

Misión Más Vida is a church that is reaching the next generation in Lima, Perú, and coordinates with other churches in Lima. It is growing fast with new conversions and baptisms every year.

Runa Simi is a ministry that exists to reach the indigenous people groups of Perú with the Word of God in their own languages. Runa Simi runs a literacy program so people can read God's Word and grow closer to Him in their own personal relationship.



Cumbre Alta Bossier City is a soccer club located in Bossier City, Louisiana. Their goal is to steer the players to the skills they need to better themselves as players and lead them off the field with the word of God.

Cumbre Alta Fútbol Camp is a series of bilingual youth summer soccer camps throughout the United States hosted by Casa Deportiva Cumbre Alta from Quito, Ecuador. The staff is made up of Cumbre Alta professional soccer players and coaches. They seek to provide a professional quality soccer camp experience to those who may not be able to access an opportunity like this otherwise.
